(THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE FROM THE SEVEN-VOLUME HISTORY OF THE CHURCH. IN THE EARLY DAYS OF THE CHURCH, RATHER STERN, "SCHOOLMASTER" DISCIPLINE, AND PEOPLE WERE CUT OFF FOR WHAT WOULD SEEM FLIMSY REASONS TO US. SEVERAL OF THEM HAD THIS DISCOURAGING EXPERIENCE, BUT MANY OF THEM RETURNED TO THE CHURCH. IN VOLUME II, PAGE 444, THE RESULTS OF A HIGH COUNCIL TRIAL ON MAY 23, 1836, ARE ENTERED IN THE RECORD. AMONG THEM THIS ENTRY. EAJ)

ALSO ASAEL PERRY WAS CUT OFF FROM THE CHURCH FOR UNCHRISTIANLIKE CONDUCT.

(IN VOLUME IV, PAGE 14, THE MINUTES OF A CONFERENCE AT COMMERCE ILLINOIS, OCTOBER 6TH, 7TH AND 8TH, 1839, CONTAIN THE FOLLOWING. EAJ)

ASAHIEL PERRY MADE APPLICATION TO BE RECEIVED INTO FELLOWSHIP, AND WAS VOTED INTO HIS FORMER STANDING.

(THE PROPHET'S HISTORY OF THE CHURCH ALSO MENTIONS STEPHEN PERRY IN SEVERAL PLACES. PERHAPS THERE WAS ANOTHER STEPHEN PERRY IN THE EARLY DAYS OF THE CHURCH BESIDES OUR STEPHEN C.; SEE THE LETTER ON PAGE 19 HEREIN WHICH WAS OPENED BY MISTAKE BY A DIFFERENT STEPHEN PERRY, FOR EXAMPLE. IN VOLUME IV, PAGE 109 UNDER DATE OF APRIL 8, 1840, IN THE REPORT OF A CONFERENCE OF THE CHURCH IN NAUVOO IS RECORDED THE FOLLOWING. EAJ)

THE COMMITTEE ON ORDINATIONS REPORTED THAT THEY HAD ORDAINED THIRTY-ONE PERSONS TO BE ELDERS IN THE CHURCH, WHO WERE ORDAINED UNDER THE HANDS OF ALPHEUS GIFFORD AND STEPHEN PERRY, WHICH REPORT WAS ACCEPTED.

(IN THIS HISTORY OF THE CHURCH, VOLUME V, PAGES 321 - 322 IN A SKETCH OF THE RISE OF THE YOUNG GENTLEMEN AND LADIES RELIEF SOCIETY, PREDECESSOR OF THE MUTUAL IMPROVEMENT ASSOCIATION, WITH A DATE OF 1843, A STEPHEN PERRY WAS ONE OF THREE "APPOINTED TO DRAFT A CONSTITUTION FOR THE SOCIETY;" AND HE WAS ALSO ONE OF

FIVE MEN FROM THIS ORGANIZATION NAMED AS "A COMMITTEE OF VIGILANCE." IN VOLUME V, PAGE 349, IS A LONG LIST OF THOSE CALLED TO MISSIONS AT THE APRIL, 1843 CONFERENCE OF THE CHURCH AT NAUVOO. AMONG THOSE CALLED WAS STEPHEN PERRY, CALLED TO CONNECTICUT. THE MISSIONARY JOURNAL OF THE 1843 MISSION BEGINS ON PAGE 15 OF THIS COMPILATION, BUT IT DOES NOT APPEAR THAT HE REACHED CONNECTICUT. EAJ)

(THERE ARE SEVERAL REFERENCES IN THE PROPHECY'S HISTORY OF THE CHURCH TO STEPHEN C. PERRY'S PARTICIPATION IN THE NAUVOO EXPOSITOR AFFAIR. THESE ARE RATHER LENGTHY AND DO NOT CONTRIBUTE MUCH TO THE HISTORY WRITTEN BY STEPHEN C. HIMSELF AND INCLUDED HEREIN ON PAGES 26 - 27, 27 - 29, AND 54 - 55. FOR REFERENCE, STEPHEN C. PERRY IS MENTIONED IN THE HISTORY OF THE CHURCH IN CONNECTION WITH THE EXPOSITOR TROUBLE IN VOLUME VI, PAGES 453, 460, 488 - 489, 554, AND 568, AND IN VOLUME VII ON PAGE 67. EAJ)

(THE FOLLOWING IS FROM A SMALL, LEATHERBOUND NOTEBOOK WRITTEN IN THE WRITING OF STEPHEN C. PERRY. BESIDES THE JOURNAL THERE ARE SEVERAL ACCOUNTS FOR APRIL, 1871, INCLUDING SHIPMENT OF ORE IN LOTS OF 80 SACKS, 100 SACKS, ETC., AND PAYMENT IN BEEF, SHEETING, DUCKING, WORK ON HOUSE, ETC. THERE ARE ALSO ADDRESSES AND GENEALOGICAL NOTES OF UNKNOWN DATE. MOST OF THIS MISCELLANEOUS MATERIAL IS OMITTED HERE, BUT THE WHOLE OF THE 1848 JOURNAL IS INCLUDED. EAJ)

OCT. 26 1848

LEFT HOME FOR THE PURPOSE OF PREACHING THE GOSPEL AND GATHERING MEANS TO GO TO THE VALLY IN COMPANY WITH BRS THORNTON AND SWANORE THIS DAY BR FERRIN GAVE ME

40 CTS WE PASSED BY GARDEN GROVE HERE WE HELD MEETING

60 CTS WAS GIVEN US FROM THIS PLACE PROCEEDED ON

THROUGH MUD AND RAIN TO THE MISSISSIPPI I RECEIVED OF MR TOWNSEND \$100 (\$1.00? EAJ) 20 OF A BR IN STRINGTOWN 50CTS AT KEOKUK WE GOT ON THE STEAMER PRARIE BIRD TO QUINCY HERE I VISITED BR HIRAM HE GAVE ME 50 CTS I GOT \$1:00 FROM BR NICHOLS SISTER ANNE McIN GAVE ME 20 CTS HELD MEETING ON SUNDAY GOT ON THE STEAMER LUCY AND ARRIVED IN ST LOUIS THE 9 NOV HERE BR SWANNER TURNED BACK WE WENT TO FULTON HERE WE GOT \$5.50 I GOT 5 CTS OF BR STANDING IN ST LOUIS THE 14 WE TOOK PASSAGE ON BOARD THE PONTIAC AND HAD

A VERY PLEASANT TIME UNTIL FRIDAY NIGHT THE 17TH WHEN THE EMPIRE COMING DOWN THE OHIO CAME IN COLISION WITH THE PONTIAC IN THE BOILER DECK JUST FORWARD OF THE BOILERS AND BROKE THE GUARDS AND A HOLE IN THE HULL THE WATER RUN IN VERY FAST AND IT WAS THOUGHT BY MANY SHE MUST SINK THE HOLE WAS AT LENGTH STOPPED AND NO ONE ON BOARD INJURED 9 HOURS TIME STOPED THE BEAK AND PUMPED THE BOAT AND WE WERE UNDER WAY AGAIN WE ARRIVED IN LOUISVILL NEXT MORNING HERE A MAN ON BOARD THE ARKANSAS FELL OVERBOARD AND WAS DROWNED

AT ST LOUIS WE WERE JOINED BY BR KASAHNE WHO TRAVELED AS FAR AS CINCINNATI WITH US WE ARRIVED AT THIS PLACE SUNDAY NOV 19 120 AT HALF PAST 2 WE ATTENDED MEETING AND SPOKE TO THE SAINTS ON MONDAY WE TARRIED AND VISITED AMONG THE BRETHREN ANEERING THEIR HEARTS AND SEEKING TO PUT DOWN FALSE SPIRITS IN THE EVENING WE ATTENDED MEETING AND SPOKE AGAIN TO THE PEOPLE ON TUES 21 BR THORNTON AND MYSELF WENT ABOARD THE STEAMER TETEGRAH No 2 BOUND TO PITTSBURG WE HAD A VERY PLEASANT TRIP AND ARRIVED IN BEAVER ON THURSDAY 23RD HERE WE TARRIED UNTIL MONDAY AMONG SOME BRETHREN FROM HERE WE TRAVELED NORTH AND ARRIVED ON THURSDAY AT BR WILLARDS FRIDAY 29 (? EAJ) SATURDAY AND SUNDAY WE TARRIED AND SUNDAY SPOKE TO THE PEOPLE UPON OUR HISTORY & C ON MONDAY WE STARTED AGAIN AND TRAVELED ON THROUGH MUD AND RAIN TO FORESTVILLE WHERE WE STOPPED TO SEE LUCINDA PERY HERE BR THORNTON LEFT ME AND HE WENT TO COLINS AND I TO EVANS ON MORSAY NEXT I LEFT EVANS AND WENT TO COLINS STAID OVER NIGHT AT ESQ LANDENS (LANDERS? EAJ) WITH BR THORNTONS NEXT MORNING PURSUED MY JOURNEY TO WOLAND FROM THENCE TO MIDDLEBURY WHERE I ARRIVED THE 16 SUNDAY I ATTENDED THE BAPTIST AND PRESBYTERIAN CHURCHES SUNDAY EVENING BR THORNTON CAME UP AND MONDAY I VISID THE PLASE THAT GAVE ME BIRYN WHICH CAUSED VERY UNPLEASANT FEELINGS TUESDAY WE STARTED AGAIN AND TRAVELED AS FAR AS WM HORACE A BRIGHAMS WHO MARRIED COUSIN JULIA AND STAYED WITH THEM OVER NIGHT THIS IS A 2 COUSIN TO BRIGHAM YOUNG FROM HERE WE TRAVELED TO SENICA FALLS A SNOW HAVING FALEN ABOUT A FOOT DEEP AND STILL FALLING VERY FAST WE TOOK THE CARS BR THORNTON AS FAR AS AUBURN NEXT MORNING I ARIVED IN CANESTOTA AND PROCEED ON MY WAY AND ABOUT SUNSET ARIVED AT UNKLE S CHADWICK NEXT DAY WENT TO UNKLE WILSON AND UNKLE I CHADWICK HERE I STOPED AND CUT 10 CORDS OF WOOD THE WEATHER WAS VERY STORMY JAN 8 SNOW ABUT 2 FEET DEEP ALSO SOME WOOD FOR UNKLE WILSON HERE I TARRIED AND VISITED FROM PLACE TO PLACE UNTIL JAN 28 (? EAJ) WHEN I STARTED BACK TOOK THE CARS AT ONIDA HAD \$212CTS CAME TO MIDDLEBURY

HAD 20CTS LEFT HERE I WORKED FOR UNKLE JONATHAN TO THE AMOUNT OF 300 2 OF WHICH OWED G PERRY HE GAVE ME 50 CTS AND AFTER WARD GAVE ME A LOOKING GLASS IN WHICH I AFTER WARD FOUND A \$100 BILL (\$1.007 EAJ) ABIAL GAVE ME 20 CTS CEPHAS 10 HIS FATHER 20 ON THE 8 OF FEB I LEFT MIDDLEBURY AND TRAVELED TO HOLLAND

MARCH 15 SHIPPED AT WELLSVILLE ON THE NELSON FOR WHEELING GOT IN IN THE EVENING AND TARRIED TILL MORN MARCH 16-17 ON BOARD THE ON BOARD THE STEAMER CONSIGNEE ON BOARD 240 PASSENGERS FOR CALAFORNIA BESIDES SCATTERING PASSENGERS 63 WAGGONS ABOUT 80 MULES BESIDES ALL KINDS OF TOOLS GOLD WASHERS GOLDANVELERS (? EAJ) &c

SEALED IN ENDOWMENT HOUSE 5 FEB 1855. STEWART MARTIN
AND ISOBEL WERE SEALED TO CORNELIUS VAN LEUVAN IN
MANTI TEMPLE 9 FEB 1893, AFTER HIS DEATH 1 JULY 1888.
THIS INFORMATION TAKEN FROM BOOK OF UTAH PIONEERS,
ARCHIVES, SALT LAKE CITY (UTAH HISTORICAL SOCIETY)
AND SPRINGVILLE, UTAH CEMETARY RECORDS.

THE SEALING OF MARGARET ELEANOR STEWART AND STEPHEN
CHADWICK PERRY WAS CANCELLED 8 DECEMBER 1863. THIS
